

**ST. MARGARET'S HALL,

DIOCESAN SEMINARY FOR YOUNG LADIES.**

VISITOR: The Right Rev. the Lord Bishop of Nova Scotia.  
PRINCIPAL: The Reverend John Padfield.

THIS School, which has been in successful operation for the last three years in Yarmouth, N.S., having, by the action of the Synod, become the Diocesan Church School; has been moved to Halifax, where it re-opened, last year.

The Principalship continues to be held by the Rev. J. Padfield. Besides the experience had in the above Institution, Mr. Padfield was engaged for some years in scholastic work in several of the large schools in England.

Mr. and Mrs. Padfield are assisted by Mrs. Wakefield, from Queen's College London, England, a lady well known as a gifted and highly successful teacher, and a competent staff of resident and visiting Governesses and Masters. This staff will be increased from time to time as the needs of the School require it.

The School offers, at a moderate cost, the advantages of a thorough and refined education, based upon Christian principles, and a comfortable home. Although designed primarily for the daughters of Churchmen, it is open to all who, being desirous of availing themselves of its advantages, are willing to conform to its rules and regulations.

The course of instruction is the same as that of the first schools in England, and is founded upon the Cambridge Examinations for women; and as far as possible the text-books recommended by the examiners are used.

Arrangements are being made whereby pupils who desire it, can pass a University Examination, and if successful, obtain a Certificate from the University.

In addition to the usual studies, classes are formed for the practice of plain, fancy and art needlework.

The School is pleasantly and healthily situated, commanding a fine view of the Atlantic. The building is new, containing spacious rooms and is fitted with all the modern appliances for health and comfort.

Special attention is given to young and delicate pupils. The boarders are treated as much as possible as members of the family, and they have individually the care and oversight of Mrs. Padfield.

The scholastic year is divided into four terms of ten weeks each. Vacations:— Three weeks at Christmas, and nine weeks at Midsummer.

A terms' notice or a terms' fee required previous to the removal of a pupil.

An entrance fee of \$10.00 is charged in lieu of each pupil providing her own linen and plate.

All fees to be paid quarterly in advance.

**TERMS.**

Board, with Tuition in the English Branches, Latin, French Drawing, Calisthenics and Music, with use of Piano for daily practice, per annum, \$300.00, to be paid quarterly in advance.

Laundries, Books, Stationery and Drawing Materials, which will be furnished at the ordinary retail prices, are the only extra expenses there need be.
