cessful weir, it must be built in a harbor or in a sheltered place, where the sea from the bay can't get at it. Notwithstanding there are lots of weirs built on outside beaches, and good money made from them when the weather is fine. But how long do these weirs stay in fishing condition once the fall winds come.

Now, Mr. Editor, do you think it would be right for the fishermen to be deprived of this privilege of seining when these weirs have been put out of commission and there are lots of herring to catch with seines?

The feeling of the seiners is for the government to permit seining in St. John and Charlotte counties, one hundred feet from fish weirs and allow them to make a living as well as the weir men.

The seiners are not a rich class of men, neither are they mean. They are satisfied to pay a license for seining the same as the weir men pay for their own weirs, and I think if this method is adopted, the fishermen of St. John and Charlotte counties will be a lot better off at the end of the season than if they prohibit the seining of herring.

This gentleman goes on to say that practically all the seines and many of the boats are supplied by the American packers. As a seiner I am prepared to argue that statement as I own my own seines and vessel and boats, and I don't thank the gentleman neither for his statement, when he called the seiners the lower class. In regard to the lobster law, the gentleman who said it should be the same as in Maine knew what he was talking about.
