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BULGARS LEAVING CANADIAN CAMPS TO FIGHT TURKS

Cobalt, Nov. 4.—The labor situation in construction camps on the Transcontinental Railway is becoming serious on account of the large exodus of Bulgarians back to their native country.

Last night's train took 140 foreigners, mostly Bulgarians, on the first stage of the journey from Cobalt, while last week over 600 men left their work for the front.

Contractors who a few weeks ago were short of men are facing a worse shortage, as it is expected that many more will leave this week for Bulgaria and uncertainties on the question of that before the middle of the month contractors will have lost upwards of 1,000 employees, who will go back to their native country to fight the Turks.
