OFFICER'S HEROIC DEED A THOUSAND MILES FROM SHORE SAVES SHIPMATE

First Officer David Blair, a powerfully built young Englishman, performed an act of bravery a thousand miles at sea when he leaped from the uppermost deck of the steamship Majestic, which recently arrived in New York, into the ocean to rescue a fireman who had jumped overboard when

cracked by the heat. There was a fog at the time. Both men were swallowed up by the mist. Mr. Blair by actual time was thirty minutes in the water swimming about when a small boat, which had rescued the fireman, picked him up.

ASSEMBLY STRIKE PUTS TENNESSEE LAWS IN JEOPARDY.

Tennessee faces the possibility of having all the laws enacted by the present Legislature, if the body as now constituted can be legally termed a Legislature, declared null and void, because thirty-seven members of the House left their seats and the State on April 1, twenty-two going to Middleboro, Ky., and the others to five different Southern States.

Governor Hooper, a republican, attempted drastic temperance legislation and the democrats scented victory and the return to power through favorable election laws. The fusionists broke the quorum then by leaving the State.
