Washington, May 19—Rear Admiral Jackson, at Ponta Delgada, Azores, cabled the navy department, tonight, that the American naval airplane, N. C.4, in command of Lieut. Commander A. C. Read, would leave Norta, Fayal, tomorrow at seven o'clock, Greenwich mean time, 3 s. m., Washington time, if weather conditions permit. A stop will be made at Ponta Delgada, the message said.
