The Right Revd. George Jehosaphat Mountain, D. D., D. C. L., Lord Bishop of The Right Revd. George Jehosaphat Mountain, D. D., D. C. L., Lord Bishop of Quebee, was the second case of Bishop Jacob Mountain, the first Anglican Bishop of Quebec. He was born 27th July, 1789, at Norwich, England, came to Canada with bis fahler, 1798, and died after a brief liness at Barfield, his country seat, on 5th Jany, "1863. He was nineteen years Rector of Quebec, and was consecrated Bishop, 14th February, 1856. He was a diligent visitor among his faok.
