In view of the speech delivered by the Secretary of State for External Affairs before the General Assembly of the United Nations on September 29 last, and in the light of the recent statement of the Prime Minister of Israel as to the lack of UN authority, what steps does the hon. minister intend to take to promote a cease-fire in that conflict?

CO-ORDINATION OF CONTROL EFFORTS IN INTERNATIONAL WATERS

department been in consultation with United States officials to see that Canadian efforts are co-ordinated in international waters?

Hon. J. J. Greene (Minister of Energy, Mines and Resources): Mr. Speaker, my department is in continuing consultation with U.S. authorities under the aegis of the International Joint Commission. I do not know of any specific negotiations that are going on in connection with this particular program that was announced by the Vice-President of the United States on Saturday last. But I certainly believe there will be some under the aegis of our continuing negotiations with the United States in this regard.

Mr. Aiken: Mr. Speaker, as a supplementary question may I ask the minister whether his department is considering a similar type of program for Canada, that is a federal-provincial co-ordinated effort?

Mr. Greene: Well, Mr. Speaker, during the summer recess the government announced its position papers in respect of the proposed Canada Water Act, and there has been continuing negotiation with the provinces on the subject matter of those position papers. It is our belief that the Canada Water Act will achieve the objectives that are envisaged in the presidential program announced in the United States, and in fact our's is a program that will be even better suited to the problem of fighting water pollution in Canada.
