FORCED OR NATURAL MOLT?
It is generally conceded that the hens that molt late in the season are the ones that will prove most valuable as egg producers. On the other hand a fowl must molt early in the season in order to be in full feather at the time of the fall shows. Time was when the average showman boasted of the showroom achievements of the fancers have come to realize that fine feathers must be accompanied with tbility to lay a goodly number of eggs in a season and that showroom records must be accompanied by nest-box records if a good season's business is to be done.
