Lieut. HERCULES ARTHUR PAKENHAM, Entered the Grenadier Guards, 14 April, 1883. Apptd. A.D.C. 1887.—*Government House, Ottawa; Rideau Club.*

Honorary Aide-de-Camp.—Lieut.-Col. HENRY R. SMITH, commanding 14th P.W.O. Rifles. Entered Militia in 1863; Lieut. in late Civil Service Rifle Regt., 1866; Capt. in 47th Batt., 1867; Major 1875; Asst. A.D.C. to Gen. Sir E. Selby Smith, 1877 and A.D.C. to Lieut.-Gen. Luard, 1881. Is a graduate of the Royal School of Artillery, Kingston. Served through North-West Campaign, 1885 (medal) as Major of the Midland Batt. Apptd. Deputy Sergeant-at-Arms of the House of Commons, 1872.—*House of Commons; Rideau Club, Ottawa.*

Extra Aide-de-Camp.—Lieut.-Col. HEWITT BERNARD, C.M.G. B. 1825. Major late Civil Service Rifle Volunteers. Entered Volunteer Service as Lieut., Nov. 1855; apptd. Deputy Judge Advocate General, 1860; Lieut.-Col. (unatt.), 1865; extra Aide-de-Camp to Gov. Gen. Can., Jan. 1865; gazetted do. to Gov. Gen. of the Dominion, Oct. 3, 1868, apptd. by H.M. the King of Spain a Knight Commander of the Order of "*Isabel la Catolica*," 1872; created C.M.G. 1872; entered Civil Service of Can. in 1858. Deputy of the Minister of Justice of the Dominion, from 1887 to Sept. 1876, when superannuated; a Queen's Counsel. Acted with Sir A. T. Galt as a Commissioner to negotiate with France and Spain for a commercial treaty, 1879.—*Toronto; British Service Club, St James, London, Eng.*

GENERAL OFFICER COMMANDING THE IMPERIAL FORCES IN CANADA.

General, Lord ALEX. GEORGE RUSSELL, C. B., s. of 6th Duke of Bedford. B. 1821. M. 3 July, 1844, Anne Emily, youngest dau. of the late Sir Leonard Worsley Holmes, Bart. of Westover, Isle of Wight. Entered the army 1839; became Capt. 1846, Major. 1853, Lieut. Col. 1856, Col. 1861, Major Gen. 1874, and Lieut. Gen. 1877; went on half pay 1871; was A.D.C. to Gov. Gen. of Can. in 1874. Served in the Kafir War 1852-3 as Deputy Assistant-Quartermaster-Gen. to 1st Division; was present at Battle of Berea (medal); served in Crimea at siege of Sebastapol (Crimea Medal and Clasp, Sardinian and Turkish Medals and Order of the Medjidie); held command at Shorncliffe 1873-4, and commanded South Eastern District, Eng. 1877-8. Apptd. to command the troops in Can., 24 May, 1883.—*Haltfax, N.S.*
