Rev. Sir,

I have to acknowledge the receipt of your letter of the 21st instant in reference to the appointment of a teacher for the Scotch Settlement School.

In reply I beg to say that the Department, while it does not insist upon the appointment of teachers holding at least second-class certificates, would like to see one of at least this standing appointed as a successor to Mr. Burr.

If suitable accommodation can be had there will be no objection on the part of the Department to the engagement of a lady teacher, and if Mrs. McDonald's testimonials are satisfactory she may, in the absence of other applications, be appointed at the salary mentioned. These testimonials, with information as to her age, should be submitted to the Department.

It is, as you have already been advised, most desirable that prompt action be taken, and a further communication from you will be awaited.

The Department is pleased to learn that you intend to become personally acquainted with the conditions at each of the Missions conducted by your Society, as it is confident that much good will result therefrom, and you may
