As stated in my letter of August 25, to Colonel Pragnell, it is necessary to submit a pplications as quickly as possible in order to be in a position to register the trap-lines, or take into consideration the claims of the Indians. I am glad to state that the main work is now done as stated by your Indian Agent H. Reed and am looking forward to an early issuance of Registration Certificates covering all trap-lines situated in the Telegraph Creek Area.
