TO MASTERS AND SEAMEN IN THE MERCHANT SERVICE.



OTICE is again hereby given, that the under-signed is duly authorized to carry into effect the British Act of the 5th and 6th of William the 4th, respecting Masters and Seamen in the Merchant Service.

Merchant Service.

That, to enable the Masters to receive the necessary Documents—that they are, by the said Act obliged to take home all balances of wages due to examen left on shore, in hospital, or elsewhere, and incapable of duty, must be paid into his hands, and

no other person can, on any account, lawfully receive the same.

Also, that all Seamen who may have been left on shore, and unable to do their duty, will be furnished with information how to act in such cases. And any master that will give a passage to England to any such seamen, will be furnished with Documents to enable them to receive the amount of their rictualling account, on their arrival, from the "President and Governors of the Corporation for "the related and support of sick, maimed, and die "abled seamen, and the widow and children of "the related and support of sick, maimed, and die "Act of the 4th and 5th William 4th, cap 52."

Under these circumstances, it is to be hoped few disabled seamen will remain in Canada, during the long winter, in a state of destitution.
