Besides the advantage of its little size and flexible cover, it is so disposed that the English and French texts are on the same page, with a perfect index.

The articles having a certain affinity with some others—and there are many—shall be referred to under each article with mention of details such as “prescription, appeal, suspension of sentence, arrest with or without warrant, if the Court of King’s Bench has exclusive jurisdiction, if the offence of the proceedings resort to the Clerk or Assistant-Clerk’s competency, if the authorization of the Attorney General or other authority is necessary, the article of the Evidence Act in connection with, and at least all the amendments inserted at their respective place. The first volume shall close with the Evidence Act, the Juvenile Delinquents Act (Federal & Provincial), the Ticket of Leave Act, the Criminal Fugitives and the Extradition Act.

The second volume shall be ready for sale in July 1917. It shall contain a “melange” of jurisprudence, of the privy Council, of Supreme Court and the latest decisions of the appellate Courts of Canada, briefly cited with every article, without repeating the law.

Moreover, the Habeas Corpus Act (Charles the second), and the jurisprudence, the Brit. North Am. Act (French and English texts).
