The mode of adjustment between the spiral and the pad renders any other fastening unnecessary. An uniform pressure throughout the whole extent of the pad is thus obtained; and the spiral, acting as a universal joint, allows the girder to adapt itself to every varying movement of the body without disturbing the pad."
