The order of the day for reading the entries in the Journals, containing the information given to this Houfe, on the 17th February 1808, concerning the Religion of *Ezekiel Hart*, Efquire, being read;

The faid entries were accordingly read by the Clerk.

Mr. Mondelet moved, feconded by Mr. Robitaille, to refolve that the Members of this Houfe, in whofe prefence *Ezekiel Hart*, Efquire, took the Oath, at the opening of the prefent Parliament, do inform the Houfe, how he took the faid Oath.

Whereupon Mr. Mure moved in amendment, feconded by Mr. Blackwood, to ftrike out all the words after the word "Refolve," and to fubfitute the following, "that this Houfe will refolve itfelf into a "Committee of the whole Houfe, to morrow, to confider of the "manner in which the Oath required to be taken by the Members of "this Houfe, before fitting and voting therein, was administered to "Ezekiel Hart, Efquire, a Member of this Houfe" for the Borough "of Three Rivers, at the opening of this prefent Parliament."

The Houfe divided on the queftion of amendment, and the names being called for, they were taken down as followeth; *yidelicet*:

So it paffed in the negative.
