SYNOPSIS OF CANADIAN NORTH-WEST LAND REGULATIONS

ANY PERSON who is the sole head of a family, or any male over 18 years old, may homestead a quarter section of suitable Dominion land in Manitoba, Saskatchewan, Alberta. The applicant must appear in person at the Dominion Land Agency or Sub-Agency for the District, agency on certain conditions, by father, mother, son, daughter, brother or sister of intending homesteader.

Titles—Six months' residence upon cultivation of the land in each of three years. A homesteader may live within this limit of his homestead, or on at least 80 acres, solely owned and occupied by him or by his father, mother, son, daughter, brother or sister.

In certain districts a homesteader is permitted to pre-empt a quarter section alongside his homestead. Price \$10 per acre. Does not reside upon the homestead or pre-emption six months in each of six years from date of immediate entry, including the time required to earn homestead patent, and cultivate 20 acres each year.

A homesteader who has exhausted his homestead right and cannot obtain a pre-emption may enter for a purchased homestead in certain districts. Price \$10 per acre. Must reside six months in each of three years, cultivate 20 acres and erect a house worth \$3000.
