Contest In Havelock for Reeve and Council.

Havelock's nominations passed off without any blood being drawn, but at times trouble threatened to arise when Messrs. Curtis and Joyce had a wordy duel. Otherwise everything was quite peaceful.

Messrs. W. T. Curtis, S. S. Joyce, Alex. Mathison and Rich. Sanderson were nominated for the Reeve ship. Messrs. J. Scott, Jos. Johnston, W. B. Ritchie, Jas. Ketchen, W. T. Curtis, Alf. Spenser, Chas. Green, R. E. Campney, F. J. Fooper, Rich. Sanderson and Alex. Mathison were nominated for the council. Messrs. J. Moore, W. A. McMaster, F. J. Hooper, Jas. Barlow, R. Anderson, D. A. Forde, Dr. Thompson, A. J. Plunkett, L. G. Hagerman and C. H. Brewster were nominated for School Trustees for the term of two years, while Edw. Fennell was elected by acclamation to fill the vacancy on the School Board caused by the resignation of Trustee Ben. Haig. Messrs. Wm. Mathison, W. T. Curtis, W. A. McMaster and Wm. Martin were nominated for Hydro Commissioner.

Mr. Mathison resigned from the reeve ship, leaving the other three nominees in the field for the head of the Council. Mr. McMaster was elected Hydro Commissioner by acclamation, the other three nominees resigning.

Lor the Council, Messrs. Campney, Ritchie, Scott, Spenser, Mathison, Johnson, Green and Ketchen, are in the field for election.

Messrs. Forde, Dr. Thompson and Jas. Barlow were elected Trustees by acclamation, all the other nominees dropping out.

Voting will take place on Monday next, Jan. 7th, from 9 until 5 o'clock.

Belmont Council In By Acclamation.

The members of the Belmont & Methuen Council were returned by acclamation on Monday, when Reeve J. F. Breckenridge and Councillors N. Whitney, E. Spencer, G. Sanders and C. Vansickle, were again elected as the 1924 council.

The only nomination outside of those gentlemen, was that of W. F. Grimth for the reeve ship, and he resigned.

The Standard congratulates the newly elected members of the council upon their election by acclamation, thus showing that the ratepayers of the township are entirely satisfied with their conduct of civic affairs during the past year.

Election In Norwood

In Norwood there will be an Election and a three-cornered fight for the Reeve ship, as Reeve Montgomery is being opposed by W. E. Pachenbaum and H. McDonald. W. W. Richardson and B. W. Squire were also nominated. Eight councillors, Messrs. R. Watson, J. A. Robb, T. Ridyard, J. R. McKelvie, S. Wildman, Thos. W. Morrison, W. Bitten and F. A. Webb, are in the field, and J. W. McLaughlin and N. C. Porter will contest the Hydro Commissionership. Messrs. B. P. Cuffe, J. G. Keefer and Geo. Hamblin are running for School Trustees.

Contest In Asphodel.

In Asphodel Messrs. J. D. O'Keefe and John Scott will contest the Reeve ship, while J. E. Brown, Lewis Beavis, Ben Cardwell, John Gooley, Adam Humphries, T. J. Lynch and Chas. Would are in the field for the council.
