Violent Anti-Clerical Agitations In Northern Italy.

Rome, Aug. 5.—The Government is threatening to impose martial law in a number of towns in northwestern Italy, unless the violence in connection with the anti-clerical agitation at once comes to an end.

At Mantau a crowd of manifestants pillaged some churches and burned several sacred objects, and at Turin a workman attacked and wounded a priest in the street.

At Savona there were violent anti-clerical manifestations, and the guard over the prison, where the Salesian fathers from Varazz, who are charged with immoral practies, are locked up, was reinforced to protect them from the mob.

The fire in St. Anthony's Church at Spezzia, set by an unruly crowd, was extinguished and the church is now guarded by a detachment of sailors.

The clericals charge that the free masons are concucting a campaign against them among the masses, and the director-general of the Saiesians has entered suit against the newspapers that published the alleged exposures. He has also asked the Government to conduct an investigation of these charges.

Priests Used Revolvers.

Rome, Aug. 5.—At Sampierdarena a crowd attacked the Saiesian Colleges with stones. Seven priests in the building got together and replied with revolver shots, whereupon the mob broke down the doors and swarmed inside.

The situation of the priests was dangerous for a few moments, and they were only rescued by the timely arrival of troops.

Anti-clerical demonstrations were announced for Saturday in a large number of Italian towns.

SAILORS JUMP INTO SEA. Reckless Attempt at Desertion by Two

Moncton, N.B., Aug. 5.—With their ship five miles from the nearest land, two Norwegian sailors jumped from the barque Auguste Leffler into the Straits of Northumberland. A little later they were rescued by a passing boat and taken to Shediac, where they have been given employment.

The escape of the two men was dramatic. With another sailor off the same ship, which was at Point Duchene for several days, they deserted some time ago and ran away. Constable Belyea, Shediac, was sent after the trio, locating them with some difficulty, and they put up quite a stubborn resistance before being taken back to the vessel, which was bound for Preston, England, and sailed from Port Duchene Saturday morning.

When the ship was some five miles out, the sailors, wearing their heavy boots and usual clothing, jumped overboard into the sea. A ship's boat was promptly lowered by order of the captain, but was swamped by the heavy seas, and the two men were left struggling in the water. A few minutes later a Point Duchene saffnoat picked them up. So far as known, there were no reasons for the daring act. The ship is in good condition, and the men were well treated. They were liable to a year, imprisonment for the first desertion, however, and the expenses involved by the captain in capturing them would have been deducted from their salaries.
