Temperance Alliance For- ward Movement.

Fellow Workers:— You will be interested to learn that the Alliance has secured the services of Rev. F. H. Basle, M. A., who is well known to the constituency, to devote the whole of his time as General Secretary to the work of temperance and moral reform in the County.

The purpose of this forward movement is to take advantage of the present crisis in the world's history, to create and foster temperance and prohibition sentiment in the County in co-operation with other societies and workers. The Secretary will give public addresses, bring before the Public and Sunday Schools the latest word of science respecting the evil effects of alcohol and other drugs, and, through the children, introduce suitable literature into the homes. He will also endeavour to stimulate a campaign for the stricter enforcement of the Nova Scotia Temperance Act, and to perform such other work as the needs of the cause demand.

In order to raise funds necessary to prosecute this work, the Alliance appeals with confidence to the temperance people of the County. Many, for some reason, not being able to do the work themselves, will, we believe, be glad to have a representative in the field. The amount needed for the purchase of literature, should easily come from offerings at public meetings. The salary of the Secretary (\$800) is proposed to be raised by pledges from individuals and temperance organizations.

An appeal will be made to each Temperance Society for a definite pledge, and to appoint an interested worker in each locality to solicit subscriptions from individuals.

Unless some such programme is put into operation, a great deal, if not all of what has been achieved in the past, and the advantages we now have in the recent and more advanced legislation passed by both the Local and Dominion Parliaments, will count for naught. It may we all feel a responsibility in the matter, as in my opinion the real work of temperance reform is only beginning.

All cash and pledges should be sent to the Alliance Treasurer, W. E. Porter, Kentville, and when convenient, it is requested that cash should accompany the pledge.

Death of C. H. Borden. Wolfville people were shocked on Wednesday to receive the tidings of the death of an esteemed citizen, Mr. Clarence H. Borden, which occurred the night before at Boston. No particulars are yet to hand but it is understood that the death took place at a hospital where the deceased was undergoing treatment.

Mr. and Mrs. Borden left some days ago for a pleasure trip as was indicated by the news columns of THE ACADIAN. Mr. Borden had not been in good health during the past winter and it was hoped that his condition might be improved by the change.

In his passing Wolfville loses one of its best known citizens and he will be greatly missed.

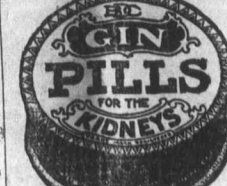
