

LABOR DAY AT KENTVILLE

FORMER WOLFVILLE BOY WHO HAS MADE GOOD

THE ACADIAN is always pleased to be able to record the success of Wolfville boys who make for themselves a name and place in the big outside world. It is, therefore, with much satisfaction that we republish the following from the New York Electrical World, of August 5th. The subject of the brief sketch is the only son of Mr. and Mrs. J. L. Franklin, of this town, and the reference will be read, we are sure, by a host of friends here and throughout the province:

Emerson L. Franklin, manager of the Warren Division of the Ohio Public Service Company, has been elected as president of the Ohio Electric Light Association. Mr. Franklin was born in Wolfville, Nova Scotia, and has spent twenty years in the electrical industry. His education was obtained in Acadia University, Wolfville, and McGill University, Montreal. He was graduated from the former college in 1900 with a B. A. degree and from the latter in 1902 with a B. S. in electrical engineering.

In September, 1902, he joined the Easton Power Company, Easton, Pa., as chief engineer. In 1907 he was advanced to superintendent and five years later was made secretary. The Eastern Pennsylvania Power Company was formed in 1912 by a consolidation of electrical power companies in and around Easton, and Mr. Franklin was appointed general superintendent of this group. He resigned this position the following year to accept the position of plant superintendent of the Empire District Electric Company, Joplin, Mo., and in 1914 organized and directed "results engineering" work for the properties of the Cities Service Company in Missouri, Kansas, Oklahoma and Nebraska.

In June, 1914, he was made general manager of the Trumbull Public Service Company of Warren, Ohio, and when this property was consolidated with the other Ohio properties in 1921 he was appointed to his present position. Under his management the gross income of this property has increased ten times and the output in kilowatt-hours more than twenty-five.

THE DISPLAY OF HERALDRY

The famous Ontario College of Art, Grange Park, Toronto, the leading college of art on the American continent, has taken up the subject of illustrating history by historic heraldic symbols in its usual thorough manner. In the Heraldic Display at the College of Arms, the following Students and others of the Ontario College of Art have sent in 48 splendidly painted armorials of 48 Baronets of Nova Scotia, the first of which titles was in 1625 and the last in 1707: "T. M." sent 24; H. A. Cordell, 4; J. Garvin Hetherington, 2; and the others, one each: Augusta C. Fleming; W. Gordon Wallace, Mary E. McNeely, W. M. Cronkwright, Helen Meyers, Dorothy Carswell, Ruth Sweeney, James Harvey, G. Broomfield, T. A. Stone, Harry Schwartz, C. Schaffer, Elizabeth Wood, H. A. Steggle, Ashforth Schaefer, Cardell Macdonald, A. Hobson, Evelyn Ballard. Fifty-two more arms of the Baronets of Nova Scotia have been promised. This leaves but 65 (there were 165 in all) to be painted. Of this Ontario College of Art, Mr. Reid, the principal, is a Fellow of the Royal College of Artists and one of his assistants, Prof. Macdonald, now passing the summer at Petite Riviere, Lunenburg, has obtained a fame justly earned.

Among the other contributors in this Display are Mary K. Lewis, S. Yarmouth, N. S.; A. G. Law-Samson, Edinburgh, Scotland; and one piece each from the official artist of the Lazon Registry of Scotland, and from the official artist of the College of Arms of England.
