Roman Intelligence.

Rome, Aug. 27.

At the reception of Sunday the Holy Father conversed at length with the Teutonic delegates, Messrs. Regazzi and Pedrazini. The latter spoke of the excellent effect produced by the Consistory of March 15th, and expressed the hope that, in consequence of the generous and peace-loving efforts of Leo XIII., and the spirit of conciliation which the Federal authorities are showing, the whole of Switzerland may soon enjoy the benefits of religious peace. In this document, which occupies several columns of the papers, there is not a single expression attacking liberal institutions or the national sentiment.
