

THE revenue for February fell off by \$278,616, of which nearly the whole was from Customs, showing how the tariff uncertainty is paralyzing trade.

THE Stanley is to continue running between Pictou and Georgetown until further notice, instead of laying up for the purpose of cleaning machinery, as previously intimated.

WORD comes from Guadalajara, Mexico, that the funeral of a man named James Campbell took place on the 6th inst., who claimed to be a son of the late Sir John Campbell, but, being a poor fellow, with almost undistinguishable grand, to have been born in Spain 154 years ago. A priest in the Church, which he attended, who is now 84 years old, says he remembers Campbell as being an odd man when he was a little boy.

THE St. John Sun remarks that it is now within a few days of eight months since Laurier took office. The public expenditure for the fiscal year beginning last July is not close on a million dollars ahead of the budget, and the Government has to meet the reverse three quarters of a million less. Still in the face of this, hardly a week passes but an official announcement is made about cutting down expenses.

MAJOR MCKINLEY entered on his duties as President of the United States, with the usual formalities, on Thursday last. The two most emphatic declarations in his inaugural address were his references to raising revenue by taxes on imports, while affording ample protection to the industries of the country, and his earnest desire for the ratification of the arbitration treaty between Great Britain and the United States.
