Promising Section Just Two Miles and a Half From Rossland.

FALU AND ITS NEIGHBORS

Great Strong Ledges of Iron and Quartz-The Eastern Star Company Is Opening Up the District-Machinery Ordered for the Falu.

A company which has been working slong quietly but effectively is the Eastern Star Gold Mining company. It owns the Falu, a claim situated between Rock and Murphy creeks, and about a mile northeast of the Highland. The claim has been surveyed and a crown grant has been applied for. At least one well defined ledge runs from south-

west to northeast through the claim.
Indeed there is a wide mineral zone running northeast as far, if not farther than Murphy creek. The ledges throughout this zone are wide and strong, a good deal of quartz appearing on the surface at various places. In some instances a pure white quartz ledge will break through the country rock. But the larger ledges have the regular iron cap observed on Red mountain.

The Eastern Star company has sunk a vertical shaft 40 feet on the Falu. At a depth of only seven feet they went through a fine ore body showing iron and quartz. When the shaft is down 100 feet a crosscut will be made to the rein. A steam hoist has been ordered and a wagon road will be built from the mine to the Columbia river, one mile and a half distant. Mr. Edlund, who and a half distant. Mr. Edlund, who represents the company, is also having a trail cut from the mine straight through to Rossland. The distance by this new trail will be only two and a half miles. Heretofore all travel from Rossland to that part of the country has been by the Highland trail, which goes ever a very high hill and is at least five miles long. The new trail will come into Rossland by way of the Evening Starmine and will avoid the hill over which the old trail pages and will be no doubt mine and will avoid the hill over which
the old trail passes, and will be no doubt
extended from the Falu to the Highland. It can also be used as part of a
new and better trail to Murphy creek
by extending it from the Falu in a
northeasterly course.

Mr. Edlund will build a wagon road to
the Columbia river for two purposes—

one to enable him to bring in machinery and heavy supplies to the mine. The other to enable him to get his ore to the Trail smelter. The ore will be hauled to the river in wagons and then loaded en boats and by them delivered to the smelter. He estimates the entire cost of transportation to the smelter at only 11.50 per ton. This rate will apply to the Highland, Lauder, Columbus, Hattie S. and all the other claims in the vicinity of the Falu, as one wagon road with short extensions will serve them

It will be seen therefore that the Falu is most advantageously situated so far as transportation is concerned. This entire district, which by the new route will be only about two and a half miles north of Rossland, is admirably situated for mining purposes. The hills are low; there is some very fair timber, and the surface is easily prospected. The Miner expects to be able to publish some good reports from this district in the near future.
