confidence once said to an admiring crowd of his supporters : 'I take it that any man in this city or any other part of Ontario can open his saloon and sell líquors, and there is not a court in the world can prevent his doing so." The Privy Council have since then looked in-The Privy Council have since then looked in-to the matter and their judgment very explicitly states that the Provincial license law is clearly within the powers conferred upon the Provinces by the Confederation Act, and as a consequence no man can open a saloon or sell liquor within the bounds of Outario without her in her time of need. first obtaining a license, or leaving himself liable to punishment by the courts. So much for the authority of the "great constitutional."-[Sarnia Observer


