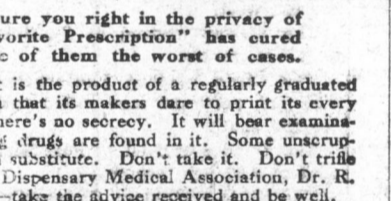

Sometimes the sleeve is set in several inches below the shoulder line, but in every case it is made sufficiently large for the garment to be easily slipped on or off.

Ermine, seal, musquash, baton martin, blue fox, shunk, black lynx and white lynx, Australian opossum and yellow fox are all exploited in the new stoles, peleries and muffs. Some of the long stoles are particularly graceful, being fashioned on the fugu-pelrine effect.

Some of the new fall waists show the eitonette effect. This is acquired by the use of embroidery edging below the shortened waist line, narrow laces being employed to finish off the bottom edge of the embroidery in some of the models.

The vogue for fringe on outer garments has tended to stimulate interest in fringe trimming for petticoats. While this form of finishing was attempted last season, it was not featured to any extent, but there is now a large showing of ruffles edged with fringe.

Trimings are lavishly used on all except the most practical and serviceable of street frocks. Narrow and wide bands of fur, lace veiled with chiffon or net, silk embroideries, gold and silver galoons and laces, founcces and bandings of both black and white chintilly are all modish.

The woman who has pumps and who does not wish to get high shoes until late in the fall can now use her cloth gutters and be very much in style. White ones are quite the fashion and their rivals are pearl gray. These are worn with the black shoes with all kinds of gowns that are short and for the street.
