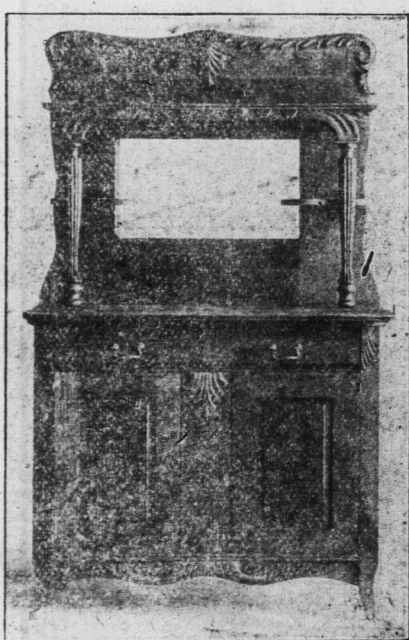

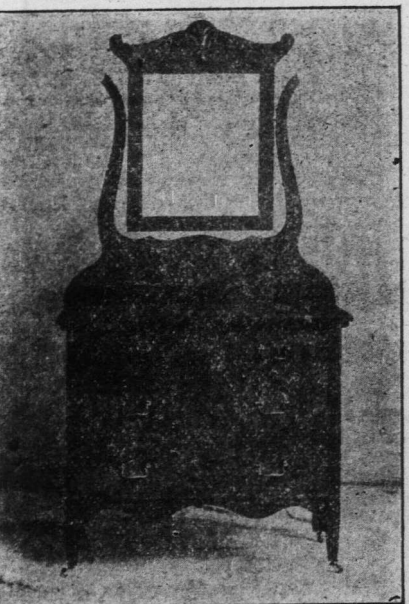

## Your Boys and Girls.

A table for the baby just learning to walk will be found useful. Just as soon as a child finds its feet and legs will support it, those feet and legs are put to use constantly. There is nothing a baby so loves as to make the circumference of a table, supporting the wobbly little legs by the aid of its hands, provided the table is low enough. Children are often backward in

learning to walk through lack of confidence, though they will stand if you give them something to support themselves with, such as a chair. The low table will be found to be of greater advantage, as it does not move so readily from under the child, and as the child does not have to stoop to reach it.

A toy placed on a table just the right height will so interest the child that it will unconsciously support itself and take the first steps, and it

is better than a patented walking machine. Care should be used not to let the baby stand too long.

## Our Native Flag.

Editor Evening Telegram.  
Dear Sir:—"Native" seems to object to "Our Native Flag" if I read his letter aright.

Is he not mistaken however in speaking of a "Newfoundland Official Flag?" There is an official Coat of Arms but since it is placed on Red Ensigns and Blue Ensigns alike (and doubtless on White and Green Ensigns also) it is difficult to see how this can be called a "flag."

Moreover I would remind him that this Coat of Arms is always made in the Native Colours: White for the ground work, pink for the figures and green for the surrounding circle of leaves. So there appears to be an official recognition of the Pink, White and Green as the distinctive Nfd. colors in the official flags to which he refers. Why? for the simple reason that these have been our native colours so many years and no one has ever heard of any others.

And since we are not all officials and the said Coat of Arms is rather elaborate for an ordinary flag, the good old tricolour seems to fill the bill very well for common use.

In conclusion, may I make a humble suggestion that as the War has drawn us all so closely together, some of our leaders may take steps to revive the old Native Society to foster among us that unity, together with love of our Island Home and devotion to our Glorious Empire and to break down the spirit of party that has kept us apart in the past.

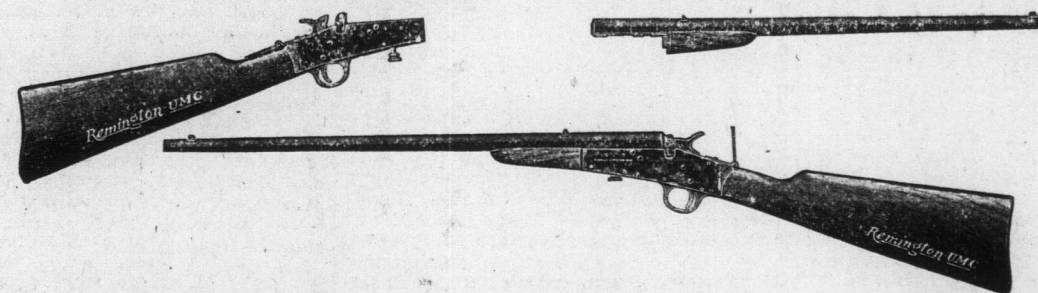

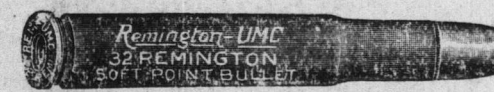
