A Ship Made of

A New Kind of Vessel Good Shipbuilding Revolution in War-Concrete Walls From England to Norway. From the middle of the Ford in Norway, where Vikings used to launch the war galleys, the strangest of world has appeared. It is entirely of concrete, except which are of steel.
