**Close of the Northern Sealfishery.**

The S. S. Neptune, Capt. Geo. Barbour, returned from the northern seal-fishery yesterday morning, reporting for 16,000 seals, mostly young harps. Capt. Barbour's account of the voyage has already been told. He never saw the ice so broken up before as he did when the main body of seals were struck this spring. During the last fortnight the Neptune had been doing hardly anything, but if the law allowed the taking of hoods the ship would have come home loaded. The S. S. Ranger, Capt. S. R. Winsor, reached port a few hours later, hauling for 10,000 seals. While coming through Bonavista Bay on the way home the ship rescued 24 men who were in distress. They were in motor boats and got jammed in the ice while seal hunting. Some of the shore people had done exceptionally well with seals this year. At the time the Ranger was searching for the body of a man from Elliston who had been driven off on the ice.

The S. S. Bloodhound, Capt. Whiteley, has closed the gates of the northern sealfishery and is the last arrival. A message to Mr. W. B. Grievé last night stated that the ship was 2 miles outside of Hr. Grace Island jammed in the ice. She will dock at Murray &amp; Crawford's premises as soon as the ice loosens. Her catch is 10,000. The northern voyage is now closed and 185,000 seals have been brought in for 11 ships. The present season promises to be one of the best on record for landings. 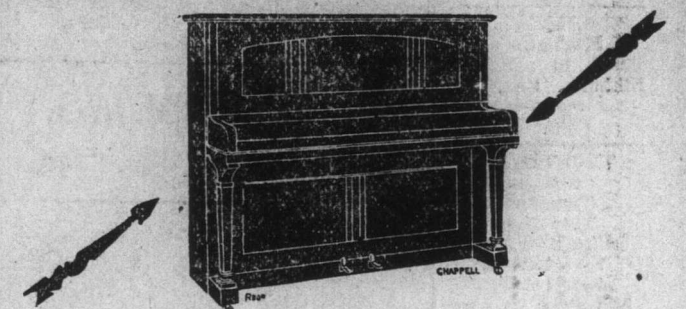
