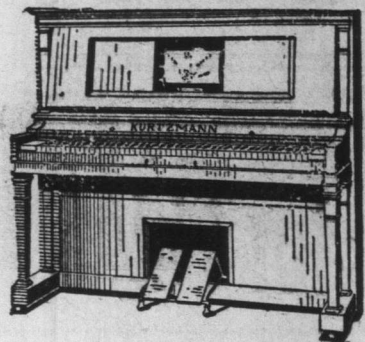

WOMEN'S MASS MEETING.
