The first, between 18 and 30 years of age, who are unmarried, or widowers without children; the second, those between the ages of 30 and 45 years, who are unmarried, or widowers without children; the third, those between 18 and 45 years, who are married or widowers with children ; and the fourth those between the ages of 45 and 60. The militia is further divided into active and reserve militia; the former consisting of volunteer militia, the regular and marine militia ; and the latter, of all those who are not serving in the active militia at the time. The volunteer militia will consist as at present, of corps raised wholly by voluntary enlistment; the regular
