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SURRENDER IS COUNSELED

By Wolmerans, the Boer Delegate to the United States and Europe.

Steamer Erie With the Strathcona Horse on Board Has Reached Gravesend—Landing of the Troops Delayed—French Captures a Convoy and 50 Wagons Besides 43 Prisoners.

London, Feb. 13.—A special dispatch from Cape Town says that A. D. W. Wolmerans, Boer delegate to the United States and Europe, writes from Paris strenuously urging the Boers to surrender.

BOER BOSH.

Chicago, Feb. 13.—"England not only will have to come to the terms of peace insisted on by the Boers, but will be forced to pay to Transvaal fighters from \$40,000,000 to \$50,000,000 indemnity," said Jan Krige, the Boer commandant under Gen. Botha, who is in Chicago. "The cables say that Dewet has crossed the Orange River with a force of 2,000 men. If this is true, it is the death-blow to England's hope of subduing the Boers, because Dewet certainly will have a force of 50,000 in the colony, and can dictate terms. The Boers have no reason in the world to surrender now."

ARRIVAL OF THE STRATHCONA.

London, Feb. 13.—The British steamer Lake Erie, which sailed from Cape Town, Jan. 20, with the Strathcona horse on board, came to anchor off Gravesend this morning. Having missed the tide, the Lake Erie will be unable to land the troops until tomorrow. Lord other persons were at the dock at a nearby hour in expectation that the steamer would arrive this morning.

A telegram to S. Cunard & Co., Halifax, says that the Strathcona horse, being 425 officers and men, leave Liverpool by the Numidian, of the Allan Line, for Halifax, on the 23rd of February.

FRENCH'S GOOD WORK.

London, Feb. 12.—Gen. Kitchener, in a dispatch from Pretoria, dated Feb. 12, says:

"French has captured a convoy of 50 wagons and 15 carts and has made 43 prisoners. We had one man wounded."

The Cape Town correspondent of the Standard says reports have been received from Delagoa Bay asserting that the natives of the Northern Transvaal have risen against the Boers.

FICKSBERG IN BRITISH HANDS.

Cape Town, Feb. 13.—The British have occupied Ficksberg, with little opposition, and have released the prisoners who were in the jail.

BRITISH PRISONERS RELEASED.

Twenty-seven Australian Cape Police and Dragoons were captured by Krutzing's commando, eight miles from Ballaspruit, Feb. 6, after a fight in which three British and five Boers were killed. The British were afterwards released.

Pretoria, Feb. 12.—The Boers mined the railway near Middelburg, Transvaal, this morning, and a British officer and two Kaldis, who were proceeding by trolley, were killed by the explosion.

Two hundred Boers are raiding the Prince Albert district, looting stores and destroying orchards and gardens. Several were killed and wounded.

Seven British yeomanry, while skirmishing, were captured by a commando near Vryburg, which was forced to retire.

Piet Dewet has arrived in Cape Town to engage the Afrikaners in the peace movement.

Col. Schermabruker, a member of the Legislative Assembly of Cape Colony, is raising a corps of German farmers in Kaffraria to resist the Boer invaders.

Sir Edward Hulse has suffered an injury to one of his legs through a fall from his horse. The injury is not serious.

The Natal railway line is again clear.

DUTCH TIRED OF THE WAR.

Williston, Cape Colony, Feb. 12.—Col. Delisle's column has arrived here. The Boers moved in three columns toward Vanwyksburg-Strathcona, maces and the Dutch here say the Boers have decided, if Christian Dewet's incursion into Cape Colony is not successful, that they will treat with a view to surrender.

TROOPER MACKINTOSH.

Ottawa, Feb. 13.—The Governor-General received the following cable from Sir Alfred Milner referring to the death of Trooper Ed. Mackintosh, son of Hon. C. H. Mackintosh: "Cape Town, Feb. 7.—No. 221, Mackintosh, died of enteric in general hospital No. 8, Bloemfontein, Jan. 28, the date given in my telegram of Jan. 31. Milner."

WANT TO SERVE UNDER "B.P."

Numerous applications have been poured in on Col. Gullitt, of Windsor, Ont., from those who wish to join the South African constabulary. More than 50 names have been received, where only ten men will be accepted.

Private Andrews, one of the South African soldiers, was banquipped at the Eureka Hotel, Windsor, Ont., Monday night. Andrews was presented with a macehaup pipe.

Trooper K. A. Brown, of the second contingent, who lately returned from South Africa, was banquipped by the residents of Clarksburg, Thornbury and surrounding country, Monday evening, and was given a gold watch and chain and lock.

BUGLE BLASTS.

The few seasons at Lorenzo Marquez is exceptionally disastrous. Many deaths of prominent British subjects have occurred. Patients from Komatipoort are arriving daily. The hospital ship is now filled to its capacity. The mortality among the Boer refugees is heavy.

Sensat. cant developments are impending here says the Pietermaritzburg correspondent of the Daily Mail. There have been wholesale thefts of military stores, and prominent officials and merchants are implicated.

It is probable that the meeting of the Cape Parliament will be postponed until September, because of the fact that martial law has been proclaimed in many districts.

The following cable has been received from Lord Strathcona: "Captains Weeks and Cockburn sail tomorrow, Lake, Ontario. Advise friends. Strathcona."
