IMPORTING COTTON FROM EAST INDIES
American Spinners Driven by Prices to Get Raw Material Abroad.
New York, April 28.—Spurred by the high price of raw cotton, American spinners have begun to import cotton from the East Indies. Long-fibred Egyptian cotton has been imported before for special use in making thread, but this is said to be the first time that foreign cotton has ever been brought to this country for commercial uses.
The average cost of East Indian cotton, it is reckoned will be twelve cents laid down at the mills, against from 15 to 18 cents for American cotton, but it is said to be of quality inferior to the domestic growth.

STEAMFITTERS ORGANIZING.
Toronto, April 28.—Mr. J. T. Kinsella, president of the International Association of Steamfitters and Helpers, attended the meeting of the local union of the Labor Temple last evening. Mr. Kinsella has just completed an organization trip to St. Thomas, where he has established a branch. Twenty more members were enrolled at the meeting last night, bringing up the total membership to 135. The organization will have 1,000 members in Canada within a year, he said. An international organizer is on his way to Vancouver, and another one is working in London, while a third is in Montreal.
