To the Electors of Restigouche. Ladies and Gentlemen

We have been chosen by a convention of friends and supporters of the Foster government to contest the County of Restigouche in the coming election. We fear that we may not be able to meet all the electors before polling, day and we take this means of making an appeal to all for

support. We are the only supporters of the Foster Government in this contest. Mr. LaBillois and Mr. Duncan, the selfchosen, self-constituted and self-heralded government supporters, are running an election under false pretenses and are not the Foster government candidates in the County of Restigouche. If they were possessed with that desire of helping the County of Restigouche, of which they boast so much, Mr. LaBillois would have accepted the position that was effered to him last June by the Foster Government on the Hydro-Electric Commission, at \$3000. a year. Resti-gouche would then have had a voice in the selection of the water powers to be developed and for which the Legislative Assembly have voted one million dollars. Our water powers at Charlo Falls and on the Upsalquitch River would have had a share of the public moneys. Scores of Restigouche



Instead of recognizing his duty towards Restigouche, Mr. LaBillois has chosen to refuse such an opportunity and has shut Restigouche County from the Hydro-Electric Com-mission and having done so, he now attempts by his present conduct to drive out of the County of Restigouche, support-ers of the Foster government. Will the people of Restigouche help him to attain his end?

The Foster government has a clean record and in the short three years during which it has held power it has encouraged agriculture to a marked degree, has increased the pay of school teachers, has inaugurated a Road policy such as never was formulated in the province, has passed the

as never was formulated in the province, has passed the Workmen's Compensation Act and has shown itself in every respect worthy of the public's confidence. Let the Foster government continue its work. Let not any misplaced sympathy retard the progress of Resti-gouche. We want something from the government and one of the best means to get it is to elect the undersigned


