The New Governor of Ontario.

The Mail, with an unwarranted assumption of authority and speaking by inspiration, yesterday published the rumor, also given in the World, that Sir Alexander Campbell was to succeed Mr. Robinson at Government House.

Mr. Robinson has been delighted to know that Sir Alexander Campbell feels well enough to face the exacting duties of the Lieutenant-Governorship and trust that he has not been calculated his strenuous and his anxiety.

The campaign just closed was exhausting in its demands on the political muscle. Sir Alexander Campbell will be to the Lord, we think, a very hard case to follow, Lord and Lady Dufferin having reached a pinnacle of public favor and having exerted themselves beyond precedent to please all classes of people.

But we have no doubt that Sir Alexander will be able to succeed in any walk of life that he may choose to adopt. Our only wonder is that he has consented to adopt this one.

Could Mr. Blake afford it?

There is no excuse for dragging Riel into Parliament again, and it is only on the Riel question that the bolters could vote for Mr. Blake. Mr. Blake cannot "turn the matter over to a better issue than one prompted by motives of Race and Revenge."

But the World believes that Riel will never be heard of again in Parliament, that his champions are by this time tired of the job, and that they will seek other channels for their energies. The truth is that the Riel business is beginning to stink even in Quebec, and it is more than malodorous outside of that province.

Restoration at Washington.

It seems inevitable that the restoration of some kind, against Canada, will be passed by both Houses of the American Congress, and signed by the President, too, even if the Senate bill, or the President's substitute adopted on Wednesday by the House of Representatives, with only one dissenting voice, we wait to see. In any event much depends upon the tact and temper of the President himself, and the President of the United States, it is remembered, has during his four years' reign a good deal more power in his country than the Queen of England has in hers.

For one thing, the passage of a retaliatory bill will certainly quicken the efforts of those statesmen who, on both sides respectively, are trying to settle the whole trouble off-hand. It will soon be seen what foundation there is or was for the many indignations attributed to the Minister West—that the whole difficulty would be settled before the fourth of March. Something important is going on between the two Governments, and, but only the other day, it was stated by authority in the British House of Commons, that the time for communicating to Parliament what proposals had recently been made had not yet come. Meanwhile the anxiety of all governments is to get something or other that shall avoid trouble during the open season of 1887, now so near at hand, is beyond question.

Bismarck's Doubtful Victory.

Bismarck has the victory this time in that the impression gains ground that the cause of abolitionists and militarists, which he represents, a few more such victories would be ruin.

At this distance we had better not trouble ourselves with too close an analysis of the German Reichstag. The customary description of the differences between the parties of which it is composed, suffices it to say that this week's event throws all degrees into the shade, while bringing into prominence the two extremes—the ultra Conservatives on one hand, and the Socialists on the other. There used to be in Germany a considerable body of the people, with a large voice in the Reichstag, who were in favor of a Parliamentary government on the English plan. But now the people are getting mostly divided between the partisans of absolute monarchy, on the one hand, and the Socialists, who aim at the destruction of all government, on the other.

No wonder that Bismarck, in his sore need, called upon the Pope to save Germany from the clamor of the Red Republic—the specter laid a while, but who can assure him that it will long continue? How long will the German people remain content that their Parliament shall have the status of a debating club, with nothing but the show of power? And with nothing but the show of power? And observe that the weight of the military system upon the people grows heavier instead of growing lighter. To the tolling masses of conscription the armed camps are deemed to not appear very many degrees better than actual war. And yet no lightning of the burden is in sight.

In Bismarck's later days the prospects of the Imperialist monarchy are dimmed by two great clouds. First, the very fact that France exists as a republic is a standing menace to Germany as an empire. Every year that the French Republic continues to exist increases the danger of the complete Republicanism. Nay, even Republicanism may soon be deemed too mild a name for the rating of Monday last shows an alarming popular tendency towards Republicanism. Next, there is the prospect of
