Ald. Davies and Allen opposed the ruling, but Ald. Hubbard and Murray supported the chairman, and Ald. Hubbard moved that Deputy Chief Graham be appointed chief. In doing so he remarked that it was his opinion that Assistant Chief Thompson should be promoted to Mr. Graham's present position, but at the same time he considered the new chief should have some say in the matter.
