THE THEBAULT MURDER TRIAL. ANNAPOILIS, Dec. 1. Court for the trial of Thebault commenced today. Judge Webster on the bench. For the prosecution, Hon. Atty. General, T. D. Ruggles, Q. C., E. J. Cowling and M. Owen. For the defence, R. Motton, Q. C., J. W. K. Johnstone and T. Shreve.

More interest is taken in this trial than any that has been held for a number of years past. The Court House is constantly crowded. After the opening preliminary, the prisoner (Thebault) was ordered to be brought into Court. His confinement appears to have told on him, but he is very calm and self-possessed.

Mr. Shreve raised the objection at this stage of the proceedings, on behalf of the prisoner, that the jury now called has no jurisdiction, this being a special session and there not being any writ of venire returned for the jury drawn in October. The Court noted the objection, and ordered that the jury drawn at the October term be sworn.

Joseph Potter (Foreman), David Lent, Chas. A. Young, Thomas Jones, Stephen Jefferson, Jacob Beals, Arthur Ramsey, Daniel Potter, Benjamin Chute, Jas. Harris, Israel Wade and Chas. A. Jefferson. T. D. Ruggles, Q. C., opened the case on behalf of the prisoner. The case on behalf of the keeper of the poor for the district in which he lives, and is charged with the murder of one Charlotte Hill, who was placed under his care by the Overseers. He condemned in deservedly strong language, the manner still practised in putting out the poor, and called attention to the evidence that would be produced, as witnesses on the part of the Crown be excluded from the court while waiting to be called. The greatest strictness is to be observed in conducting this trial.

DR. BINGAY'S EVIDENCE. I am a coroner. Held an inquest on the body, it was on the barren when I first saw it about one and a half miles from the Meadow Road. Saw the body in performing my duty as coroner. It was about the 4th of September. Went a mile and a half on the Meadow Road. The body was about one hundred yards from the Meadow Road. Behind and to the northward of the body was a large granite rock, and some smaller stones in front, making a hollow, in which it was laid. The body was partially consumed by fire. The legs, above the feet up to the hips, were burned off. The feet were scarcely singed. The lower part of the hips were very much burned so that part of the abdomen could be seen. The upper part of the body was singed, but perfect enough to be recognized. It was the body of a female. There was a cut on the head on the left side back of the ear. Saw no other marks of violence. The face was turned away from the granite rock so as to escape the fire. The left side of the body was close to the rock, lying on the back. The face was discoloured, but easy to be recognized by those who were acquainted with it. She was undoubtedly pregnant before death. Probably about six months. Held the inquest on the spot. Had the remains brought to Annapolis in a box for identification. They were deposited in James Gavaza's office in charge of a constable named Scott Kippy. They were afterwards brought to the Court House at the time of the investigation. The arms were a good deal shrivelled. The right hand was burned off at the wrist. Saw the remains photographed while they were in Gavaza's office. The photograph was produced. (Objected to by Mr. Shreve as secondary evidence.) The question is, is it a correct representation of the remains. At the request of Mrs. Addie Scott, I removed the lip and found the front teeth, except part of a front tooth entire, I think tongue was a little protruding. Can give no particular reason for it.

Cross-examined by Mr. Shreve.—Was first informed of the murder by one of the Overseers. There was a cut over the temple. I do not think it was sufficient to cause death, but would stain a person. It, and the bruise on the back of the head, could not have both been caused by a fall. There were no remains of wood under the girl—nothing but ashes; made an examination and found she was pregnant.
