for the first time, it records several
species of Birds as being residents
of that region not mentioned by pre-
vious writers, but space will not perm-
it hereto give their names.

In Volume V of the C. V & G there is no
article on Ornithology, except the one by
Mr Vernon, and to his attention will be
directed in the next chapter, but all those
articles that we have reviewed were
carefully read by him, and did much
stimulate his studies of the subject, and
prompt his avian composition.
Here leaving this subject for future
investigation we again take up the
line of Young Vernon's biographical
narrative.
