## The Sick and Funeral Benefit.

The Sick and Funeral Benefits are as follows:

- (1) Benefits are as follows - It is the intent and purpose of this system to effect a premium for the first two years of service, as well as for the next ten years, so as to give the member a further sum of \$100 per month for the next seven years, which may be increased to \$150 per month for the next three years, if the member continues to be employed.

To secure these benefits it is necessary to pay an Enrollment Fee of \$1.00 and a Registration Fee of \$1.00.
