Lesson No. 14 of Eaton's One Hundred Lessons in Business contains a very helpful short method of multiplication which was discovered quite recently by an architect of Lowell, Mass. It is really one of the best things ever published, and the whole matter is so simple that it is a surprise to everyone that it was not thought of long ago. Of course the rule doesn't apply to all numbers, but it applies to an immense number, and anyone after reading Lesson 14 can tell at a glance which numbers will work and which will not. For example multiply 63 by 48.

Say 8 times 3 are 24 and put down both figures. Then say 5 times 6 are 30, and put down both figures.

Always add 1 to the second figure of the multiplier. Apply the rule given above to the exercises at the left. It is more than likely that you have spent hours multiplying (finding the value of certain things at certain prices) when this could have been done in minutes. The rule saves nine minutes out of ten every time. In an example where each number contains four figures, twenty figures are saved in working.
