Duration and withdrawals

1. This Convention should be of unlimited duration.

2. Each State Farty to this Convention should in exercising its national
sovereignty have the right to withdraw from the Convention, if it decides that extraordinary events related to the subject matter of the Convention, have jeopardized its supreme interests. It should give notice of such withdrawal to the Depositary three months in advance. Such notice should include a statement of the extraordinary events it regards as having

jeopardized its supreme interests.

Comments

- Some delegations suggested that States Parties should be required to give notice of withdrawal not only to the Depositary but also to the Security Council on the grounds that extraordinary events which jeepardize their supreme interests have to be invoked for such withdrawal.

- A delegation suggested the deletion of the reference to "extraordinary events" as a corresponding rephrasing of the element.
