

Your Committee recommends that it be given leave to sit while the House is sitting.

By unanimous consent, on motion of Mr. Fraser, seconded by Mr. Lennard, the said Report was concurred in.

On motion of Mr. Argue, seconded by Mr. Herridge, it was ordered,—That an humble Address be presented to His Excellency the Governor-General, praying that he will cause to be laid before this House a copy of all correspondence, telegrams and other documents exchanged between the Federal Government and the Saskatchewan Government since January 28, 1959, dealing with the construction of the South Saskatchewan River Dam. (*Notice of Motion No. 66).

On motion of Mr. Argue, seconded by Mr. Herridge, it was ordered,—That an humble Address be presented to His Excellency the Governor-General, praying that he will cause to be laid before this House a copy of all correspondence, telegrams and other documents exchanged between the Federal Government, and (a) officers of any dominion or provincial farm organization; (b) each provincial government, since June 1, 1957, regarding trade with Japan. (*Notice of Motion No. 68).
