The Clerk informed the Senate that the Honourable Senator Drouin had made and subscribed the Declaration of Qualification required of him by The British North America Act, 1867, in his presence as the Commissioner appointed to receive and witness the said Declaration.

The Honourable the Speaker took the Clerk's chair.

The Honourable the Speaker rose and informed the Senate that a Commission had been issued under the Great Seal appointing him Speaker of the Senate. The said Commission was then read by the Clerk, as follows:—

TO HAVE, hold, exercise and enjoy the said office of Speaker of the Senate, unto you the said Mark Robert Drouin with all and every the powers, rights, authority, privileges, profits, emoluments and advantages unto the said office of right and by law appertaining during Our pleasure.
