

result of economic revisions, exceeded this fixed salary maximum, or if their new position is reclassified to a higher level or if the employee is promoted to a higher level position.

Employees not selected for positions in the new organization who are occupying supernumerary positions will retain their current classification level and, where performance is satisfactory, will be allowed to proceed to the present salary maximum for that level in accordance with civil service pay regulations. These salary maxima will not be increased as a result of revisions arising from cyclical pay reviews. This supernumerary arrangement will be interim in nature pending the placement of affected employees in continuing positions in the new organization or elsewhere.

Present departmental policy precludes the demotion of any employee solely as a result of the current changes in the organization of the department.

7. As a result of the reorganization up to March 9, 1967, departmental employees have been promoted in the following numbers: (a) Nil, the reorganization staffing program has not, as yet, reached positions at these levels; (b) eight; (c) 44; (d) 59.

The staffing program in groups (b), (c) and (d) have not been completed.
