My dear Mr. Crandall:-

Let me acknowledge with pleasure your letter of January 6th.

I remember very well the days at Camblaine l'Abbe when No. 16 Squadron were close by. I had the pleasure last summer of making a tour of the battlefields in company with Major Gibson, who was Assistant to General Ross, A.D.M.S. to the 1st Division. We spent a half hour or so in Camblaine L'Abbe looking up familiar places. Altogether we were six days going over the battlefields and thoroughly enjoyed, in a way, every minute of it. It is impossible, however, to make such a tour without experiencing a feeling of depression, because one recalls at every turn so many fellows who are still there.

Eric McDonald of the 10th is now a member of the permanent force in the A.S.C. Division. I believe he is stationed at Toronto at present. I saw Dan Ormond last October while making a visit to the Coast. Dan is at present in command of the Saskatchewan Military District and, I believe, is doing very well. He has on his staff Colonel Paul Tudor, whom you will remember as one of the 5th Battalion officers, also Colonel Frank Ware who is on Divisional Headquarters staff.
