Aunt's title, however, became current every where, and was most completely confirmed in the year 1750, when the gave with more than common folemnity a kind of annual feast, to which the colonel's two brothers, and his fifters, aunt's fifter, Mrs. Cornelius Cuyler, and their families, with feveral other young people related to them, affembled. This was not given on a flated day, but at the time when most of these kindred could be collected. This year I have often heard my good friend commemorate, as that on which their family flock of happinels felt the first diminution. The feast was made, and attended by all the collateral branches. confifting of fifty-two, who had a claim by marriage or descent, to call the colonel and my friend uncle and aunt, befides their parents. Among these were reckoned three or four grandchildren, of their brothers. At this grand gala there could be no less than fixty perfons, but many of them were doomed to meet no more; for the next year the fmall-pox, always peculiarly mortal here, (where it was improperly treated in e with the
