of this town is something over 5,000, and it justly claims no mean conmercial importance, as its lumber interest has for many years support an extensive commerce with the leading markets of the country. Steament the and barges are in constant movement between this point and Green Balto vand the traffic in the lumber and other lines of trade supports this thriving community in a manner justifying the increase of population which hor the been noticeable during the past years.

A very fine water power is derived from the Fox river canal, which is a fall of seven feet, and this is utilised by a number of manufacture ditiestablishments. It may be interesting to note that the water level at the spoplace is 773 feet higher than the Atlantic ocean, 195 feet higher than Lalege Michigan, and 173 feet higher than the Mississippi at the mouth of the Wisconsin river. Portage is the northern terminus of the Madison a contrage line of the Chicago, Milwaukee and St. Paul Railroad.

Fox Lake, in Dodge county, Wisconsin, is a pretty and prosper rail town of 2,000 inhabitants, located on Beaver Dam river, at the foot of I the lake. It has an excellent water power, and contains a number of larbeg manufacturing establishments. The lake is a beautiful body of wat alm nearly circular in form and in the neighborhood of three miles in diameter It is studded with romantic islands, and is a favorite resort of angle num Forty thousand young Mackinaw trout are planted here annually, whithese, with the numerous game fish indigenous to the waters, give the locality a deservedly high reputation for its piscatorial allurements.

whit The only public institution of note in the vicinity is the Fox Lake Sewith inary, a mixed school, very highly esteemed throughout Dodge and that adjoining counties of the state. The land in this locality is high and reprocing, and a good deal of prairie is encountered. The soil is a rich bly year loam, with clay sub-soil. Like all that part of the state, the country hin t is finely wooded, red and white oak, hickory, poplar, white and black alim basswood, white and red elm, black cherry, and a limited amount of hope a . soft maple, being the leading timbers.
