BY-LAW No. 876.

By-Law to Appoint Milo Knowland to take the Census of the Unincorporated Village of Chesterville.

Whereas Jeremiah Hanes and one hundred and seventeen other freeholders and householders of the Village of Chesterville and its vicinity, petition the Council to incorporate the Village of Chesterville; and whereas it is necessary to take a Census of the inhabitants under the direction of this Council, to ascertain whether the Village has the requisite number of inhabitants to entitle them to incorporation as a separate municipality.

Be it enacted a By-Law of the Corporation of the United Counties of Stormont, Dundas and Glengarry, that Milo Knowland of Chesterville, be appointed, and he is hereby appointed to take the Census of the said Village of Chesterville, and to report to the Council. Passed, signed and sealed, in open Council, this 18th day of June, A.D., 1889.

BY-LAW No. 877.

By-Law to Incorporate the Village of Chesterville in the County of Dundas.

Whereas upwards of one hundred freeholders and householders residing upon Lots Nos. Seventeen and Eighteen, in the Fourth Concession, and portions of Lots Nos. Seventeen and Eighteen, in the Third Concession of the Township of Winchester, in the County of Dundas, hereinafter described and referred to; have by their petition prayed that those Lots and Portions of said Lots be set apart from the said Township of Winchester, in the County of Dundas, and erected into an Incorporated Village, by the name of the Village of Chesterville, and that the inhabitants thereof be constituted a Corporate Body Politic, apart from the said Township, under the name of the Corporation of the Village of Chesterville.

And whereas it appears by the returns made by Milo Knowland, the Census Enumerator appointed to take the Census of the inhabitants residing within or upon the Lots and portions of Lots aforesaid, that the number of inhabitants contained within the said Lots and portions of said Lots, exceed seven hundred and fifty.

And whereas it appears that the residences of such inhabitants are sufficiently near to form an Incorporated Village, and it is desirable to grant the prayer of the said petition, and incorporate the said Lots and portions of said Lots therein and hereinafter particularly described as the Municipality of the Village of Chesterville.

Be it therefore enacted a By-Law of this Municipal Corporation of the United Counties of Stormont, Dundas and Glengarry,

1. That from and after the 19th day of June, A.D., 1889, Lots numbers Seventeen and Eighteen, in the Fourth Concession, and portions of Lots numbers Seventeen and Eighteen in the Third Concession of the Township of Winchester, in the County of Dundas, within the limits and boundaries hereinafter particularly described, shall be set apart from the said Township of Winchester, and erected into and constituted an Incorporated Village by the name of the "Village of Chesterville," and that the inhabitants thereof shall be constituted a Corporate Body Politic, apart from the said Township, under the name of the Corporation of the Village of Chesterville.

stituted a Corporate Body Politic, apart from the said Township of Winchester, under the name of "The Corporation of the Village of Chesterville," and shall have all such powers and privileges and liabilities as are now or may hereafter be conferred or imposed upon Incorporated Villages.

2. That the Municipal Corporation of the United Counties of Stormont, Dundas and Glengarry, do assign as boundaries of the said Incorporated Village of Chesterville, the boundaries and limits hereinafter set forth, that is to say:

Lots numbers Seventeen and Eighteen, in the Fourth Concession of the said Township of Winchester, and portions of Lots Seventeen and Eighteen, in the Third Concession of the aforesaid Township, described as follows:—

Commencing at the north-east corner post of said Lot number Seventeen, in the Third Concession thereof, a distance of ninety rods; thence south parallel to the eastern boundary of said Lot number Seventeen, a distance of eighty-eight rods and fourteen feet; thence east parallel with the northern boundary of said Lots Third Concession, a distance of one hundred and eighty rods; thence north, parallel with the western boundary of said Lot number Eighteen, in the Third Concession, a distance of eighty-eight rods and fourteen feet, to the northern boundary thereof; thence west along the said northern boundary, a distance of ninety rods, to the place of beginning.

3. That the first election for Councillors in said village shall be held at the building known as the Town Hall, in the said Village of Chesterville.

4. That Milo Knowland shall be the Returning Officer to hold such first election.

5. Nothing herein contained shall effect any taxes imposed for any debt heretofore contracted by the Township of Winchester, so far as same shall effect the said Incorporated Village, but the said Village of Chesterville shall only be liable to pay to the Treasurer of the said Township of Winchester, in each and every year until such existing debt heretofore contracted as aforesaid shall be satisfied or discharged, the same amounts as were or ought to be collected for the said existing debts, within the said heretofore assigned limits and boundaries of the said Incorporated Village of Chesterville, for the now present or current year, and the said amounts shall be a debt against the said Village.

BY-LAW No. 878.

By-Law to Authorize the Borrowing of Money for the Completion of the River Beaudette Drainage Improvements.

Whereas it will be necessary to borrow a certain sum of money to meet the expenditure upon the River Beaudette drainage improvements between this date and the time that the debentures are sold.

Be it therefore enacted a By-Law of the United Counties of Stormont, Dundas and Glengarry, that the Warden and Treasurer be and they are hereby authorized to borrow from some Chartered Bank of the Dominion, for the purpose above set forth, such sum or sums of money as may be necessary in the opinion of the River Beaudette Drainage Com-
