(Continued From Page 1).

Over Sir Robert L. Borden and Hon. Martin Burrell, secretary of state, it reads as follows: "May it please your royal highness: On behalf of the government and people of Canada, we tender to your royal highness our loyal and cordial welcome.

The notable development in the status of the great Dominion has tended to strengthen the influence of the crown in binding together all the nations of the empire thru the tie of a common allegiance in which the united purpose and endeavor of all the British peoples find effective expression.

Replying to the address of the Government of Canada, his royal highness spoke as follows: "Mr. Prime Minister and Gentlemen—I am deeply grateful for the cordial terms of your address and for its warm expression of your loyalty to the crown and person of my father, the King.

Shares Canada's Hopes. "You have spoken, Mr. Prime Minister, of allegiance to the crown as the expression of that common devotion to British institutions and British ideals which unites all the people of the empire. I am conscious that this lays upon me, as his majesty's heir, a very grave and a very inspiring responsibility.

Scene at Garden Party. The spacious lawns of Government House were a blaze of color this afternoon on the occasion of the garden party given by Their Excellencies the Duke and Duchess of Devonshire in honor of His Royal Highness the Prince of Wales.

Princess's Reply to Ottawa. In reply to the address of the city of Ottawa, the Prince of Wales said: "Mr. Mayor and gentlemen: You have termed my welcome affectionate. I thank you for that word, since it also describes my own feelings toward the people of Canada who have greeted me everywhere since my arrival with so rapidly increasing power, both moral and material, as one of the great nations of the British commonwealth.
