FIGHTING BOB SHOWS FIGHT VANQUISHES POLICE FORCE

With Knife Slashes Constable in Arm and Puts Two Others on Run.

Orangeville, Nov. 19.—(Special.)—What might have proved a serious and perhaps fatal fight, occurred here this afternoon about 5 o'clock, when three constables undertook to arrest Bob Cook, a notorious character, and widely known as "Fighting Bob."

He was to appear at Grand Jury three weeks ago for creating a disturbance at the fall fair, but refused to comply with the summons, and a warrant was issued for his arrest. Two garrulous papers were also out against him, and to-day he was passing through this town with his threatening outfit. Bailiff James Morrison served these papers, whereupon Cook at once trampled them into the mud and rode on.

Chief Speers was notified, and together with High Constable Hughes and Night Constable Hughes, located their man in the east end of the town and attempted to arrest him. Cook, who is considered the strongest man in this district, and a wickered fellow, immediately showed signs of fight. The constables were apparently getting the best of the tussle, when Cook managed to draw a large knife from his overcoat, and slashed Constable Habert, inflicting a terrible wound in his left arm. Having one arm disabled, Cook made a pass at Constable Hughes' neck, but fortunately missed. Failing in this he resorted to the throwing of stones, and did effective work on Constable Hughes, who was hit in the chest. He then ran to the north, pursued by the constables, and was seen this evening as he was riding a westbound train. It is said he was in town for about an hour previous to his departure, and is credited with the threat he would never be taken alive.

Conservative Club Discusses Motion for an Enquiry.

At the fortnightly meeting of the Toronto Conservative Club at the Temple Building last night, J. E. Cameron introduced a motion to the effect that the club discover from the proper authorities if it was the intention of the attorney-general's department to take action in reference to the evidence of Peter Ryan, registrar of East Toronto, in the Miller-Beck case. The motion was discussed shortly and action postponed until the meeting two weeks hence at the Labor Temple.

HAMILTON HAPPENINGS TO SUBMIT \$75,000 BYLAW FOR ISOLATION HOSPITAL

Barton Township Falls to Substantiate Claim to Rights Over Beach.

Hamilton, Nov. 19.—(Special.)—The board of health this evening decided to ask the city council to submit a by-law to the ratepayers next January to raise \$75,000 for a fever isolation hospital. It is proposed to erect a hospital on the Ottawa plan. The board also passed some important amendments to the health bylaw with references to slaughter houses and the keeping of animals within the city limits.

At a meeting of the markets committee this evening it was announced that an effort would be made to get the board of education to allow the city collector to keep his present office, altho it had been previously arranged that he was to move to adjoining quarters and give his office up to the board of education office.

Fakers Must Move On. Street fakirs will not be allowed to do business on the central market, except in the neighborhood of the Savoy Theatre. It was stated that the new patrol stable, with the exception of the plumbing, would be completed this year. All the plumbers are too busy at present to tender on the job.

About 350 bushels of carrots raised on the jail garden were sold to the James Dunlop Company at 13 cents a bushel. James Collins, one of the men injured in the gas explosion at the T. H. and B. shops, was too ill to appear at the inquest on the death of George Perkins, who was fatally burned in the mishap, and the enquiry was adjourned for two weeks.

Saltwater Glass Good. In a suit before Judge Teetzel this afternoon H. Duff failed to substantiate Barton Township's claim to municipal rights over the beach from Dunes to a point near the canal. Saltfleet has exercised municipal rights over this strip for 50 years, and was confirmed in her rights by Judge Teetzel.

Costs Less Money. This morning J. W. Lyon, secretary of the Western Ontario Municipalities Niagara Power Union, notified the city that the hydro-electric power commission had secured new information that would enable it to cut down its first estimate of the cost of power from \$2 to \$3 a horse power.

ROOSEVELT LIKES J. J. HILL

Makes Distinction Between Two Classes of Moneyed Men.

Paris, Nov. 19.—The Liberte is publishing a series of articles recounting the experiences of one of its writers who recently held an interview with President Roosevelt at the White House.

The writer says he was very much surprised at the president's appearance. All the photographs show Mr. Roosevelt as a stern man, whereas he found generally the first characteristic of his expression. He was surprised also at the freedom and democracy of the White House, where a citizen or a foreigner quite gained the idea that the president's—was very different from the Elysee.

Roosevelt talked French, whereby, says the writer, he lost his English eloquence, but the writer gained in not losing a word of the president's discourse. The writer says it is necessary for his readers, in order to understand the hatred and contempt President Roosevelt professes for moneyed men, to remember that he always makes two distinctions. For those who enrich themselves even enormously and at the same time benefit the country by endowing it with a new industrial force Mr. Roosevelt has the fullest indulgence. In the class the president named James J. Hill, pointing out to the writer on a map Hill's railroad construction.

The president reserves all his hatred and disgust for those whose only aim in life is to pile millions upon millions for their own sole satisfaction and personal enjoyment. These money-plotters, thru immoral trusts, dredge all the nation's money. They are the ones that must be destroyed.
