

Rainy Weather Causes Many Scratches and One Race is Declared Off

FORT ERIE, July 23.—Tom Dolan, from the stable of W. Day, was the medium of a killing this afternoon, when he won the second race in a ridiculously easy manner. He went to the front and won, pulled up, by ten lengths, after being backed from even money to 7 to 10. This horse ran his best race at Montreal last fall, when just such a coup was pulled off. The fourth race this afternoon was drenched off owing to the numerous scratches, and the card was reduced from seven to half a dozen races.
